CORE PRINCIPLES

Actions speak louder than words – lead by example and celebrate what you are achieving within your community.

It's action time – find your allies within the school, and make a plan of action to achieve each of the different actions in the Award's action plan.

Set to work – it's time for some investigation – what does your school already do to protect the coastal environment and where could it do better.

Get your team ready: Identify fellow Guardians of the Coast and pick your A team (hint – try to include a wide range of players in your team including teachers, school managers, PTA members, pupils and TAs)

Voluntarily sign up to the School Award and become an active Somerset Coastal Guardian

1	Pass the baton: Elect a new coastal champion team before the end of the school year to mentor incoming students and to keep up the good work.			✓
2	Write a letter or send a school petition to your local MP or local council about a marine issue or campaign that you have identified during coastal champion activities and which you feel they should take action on.			✓
3	Work with the school management team to ensure that all buying policies are water, waste and nature friendly.			✓
4	Strength in numbers: pair up with another school to encourage them to follow your positive lead by signing up to become #CoastalChampions or share good practice you've developed with an existing Coastal Champion school.			✓
5	Take to the coast: organise a school beach clean or local litter pick or attend a public beach clean/litter pick with friends and family.			✓
6	Spread the word: Tell friends and family about what you have learnt, so they can apply the same positive behaviour at home and at work.			✓
