Grease is the Word

Following the successful launch of our inaugural 'Love Swanage' event, Project Officer Sarah Spurling took our specially commissioned Fats, Oils and Greases (FOG) wobble board to the local household recycling centre in Swanage, where residents can recycle their used cooking oil.

Oils from cooking can harm the environment and apart from the possibility of blocking your sinks and drains, oil reaches the sea through the drainage system and can be harmful to marine life. Our campaign message focused on mindful disposal of waste cooking oil, in a way that doesn't damage drains or the environment, plus it also helps produce bio-fuel which is much less polluting than fossil fuels.

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Residents Love Swanage...Its official!

Residents of the town came along in their droves to our inaugural event on Saturday 3 November, to celebrate Swanage and find out about things they can do to help the local environment.

The event was organised in partnership with Swanage Town Council, hosted at The Swanage School and opened by the Mayor Councillor Mike Bonfield, who welcomed visitors and shared his own stories and environmental tips.

Visitors took part in free bushcraft sessions, heard fantastical 'eco' seaside stories, joined in with wildlife activities and took part in arts and crafts whilst enjoying a cuppa from popular local Cafe The Salt Pig, who provided a brilliant 'pop up' serving lots of incredible edibles.

There were stands galore and interactive displays from local organisations including the Dorset Wildlife Trust, Litter Free Purbeck, Wessex Water, Durlston Country Park, Fore Adventure, Storyteller Martin Maudsley, Fair Trade Swanage and Stepping in 2 Nature.

Throughout the campaign, we will be reaching out to residents and businesses with a series of activities and initiatives highlighting ways that they can make simple changes to help reduce the impact of Fats, Oils and Greases or 'FOG' in the drainage system.

We're looking forward to hosting the event again next year and making it even bigger and better.

Refill

We're awash with success and proud to support #RefillDorset. It's been key in helping to change people's habits. Every time somebody refills rather than buying a new bottle from a shop or cafe, one fewer bottle runs the risk of ending up as litter or going to landfill.

Single use plastic water bottles are one of the most frequently found items of litter on our beaches here in Dorset, so it's important to take as many out of circulation as possible. We hope that by asking businesses to offer this simple service, and encouraging customers to take it up, it will become the norm to invest in a bottle you love and take it everywhere with you.

Participating businesses told us it makes perfect sense to offer free tap water to their customers, and many are keen to promote something they're doing already. Refill not only saves customers money but, for a cafe, can also cut down rubbish and recycling bills. Most importantly it means they can show that they're a friendly business that cares about their customers and local environment, which is increasingly important in building customer loyalty.

Campaigns 'Don't Be A TOS53R'

Updates and progress on Litter Free Dorset by Project Officer Sophie Colley

In November the 'Don't Be A TOS53R' campaign was launched in partnership with Keep Britain Tidy aimed at those who toss their rubbish out of car windows. LFD (Littr Free Dorset) worked with Dorset Waste Partnership to identify litter hotspots throughout Dorset and implement the campaign. 'Don't be a TOS53R' has been designed to send a hard-hitting message to drivers and their passengers that our roads are not one giant litter bin and that the owner of a vehicle can be fined up to £100 if rubbish is seen being thrown out of a car window. We have used vans, billboards and signs to promote the campaign and spread the message.

The launch went well, and Sophie was interviewed by Wessex FM and BBC Radio Solent along with Frank Roberts from Litter Free Purbeck. Working Group members have supported the campaign in a variety of ways, predominantly through spreading the word on social media as well as displaying campaign artwork on their business premises.
